Federal health regulators are getting tough on a new type of nursing home abuse: humiliating and degrading photos and videos of residents posted on social media by employees. Exploitation of residents through these postings is considered abuse, and complaints will now be investigated by state officials who will report employees to state licensing agencies. Nursing homes can—and must—stop this form of abuse.

## Ban on Forced Arbitration Is a Big Win for Abuse Cases

A new ruling issued in September stops any nursing home that receives federal funding from forcing its patients to resolve abuse claims out of court. 

